Class 67 Special Anysize Jumping is only open to dogs 8YRS OLD AND UNDER not entered in any other class on this day.

Class 68 Special Anysize Jumping is only open to dogs 9YRS AND OVER not entered in any other class on this day.

Jump heights for both of these classes will be 350mm for large and medium dogs, and 250mm or less for small dogs Please state dogs size on the entry form.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows, (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a **clear round completed within the course time set by the judge** will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact obstacles and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries, It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1. The three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs

Grade 1 (ELEMENTARY) For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows. *N.B. OWNERS, HANDLERS OR DOGS PREVIOUSLY QUALIFIED OUT OF GRADE 1 (ELEMENTARY) ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THIS CLASS*

Grade 2 (STARTERS) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7 but have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Grade 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows. *N.B. OWNERS, HANDLERS OR DOGS PREVIOUSLY QUALIFIED OUT OF GRADE 2 (STARTERS) ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THIS CLASS*

Grade 3 (GRADUATE) Open to dogs which are not eligible for grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for grade 4,5,6, or 7.

Grade 4 (NOVICE) Open to dogs having which have gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at grade 3 or elected to progress from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for grade 3,5,6, or 7.

Grade 5 (INTERMEDIATE) Open to dogs having which have gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for grade 3,4,6, or 7.

Grade 6 (SENIOR) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for grade 3,4,5, or 7.

Grade 7 (ADVANCED) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at kennel club licensed agility shows, 2 first places must be gained in agility(not jumping) classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special Classes".

The eligibility for "Special Classes" must be defined by the society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles and the A-ramp, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

GRADE CHANGES

Attention is drawn to Regulation 20, any changes **MUST** be made at least 14 days before the date of the show, to admin@swap-live.com

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, large dogs who have not competed before 1st January 2006 and ALL Small and Medium dogs MUST have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show. Record books may be inspected at the request of the Judge or show management

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. ENTRY FEES: £2.90 per dog per class.
3. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
4. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries made without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/Competitor.
5. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The height of jump obstacles for Special Anysize Jumping - Large and Medium jump height 350mm Small dogs jump height 250mm or less.
Special Veteran Jumping - Large dog jump height 450mm, Medium dog jump height 350mm, Small dog jump height 250mm or less
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
13. Kennel Club Standard Marking Regulations will apply.
14. Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Large dogs are those measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
15. Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Medium dogs are those measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.7ins) and those measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
16. Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Small dogs are those measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from competition: A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:-
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues to compete.
19. The Show management will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
20. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition i.e. **24th MARCH 2014** shall be counted when entering a class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
21. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them shall be reported to the Kennel Club.
22. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dog suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing this Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
23. Animals in Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show management, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
24. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within one month of the show date.
25. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Internet entries may be made via www.swar-live.com Postal entries will only be accepted on Kernow K9 official Entry Forms (or photocopies). Entries submitted on any other Form will be returned.
26. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
27. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
28. No refunds will be given on incorrect entries. Nor after closing date, unless covered by rule 24.
29. If you fail to clean up after your dogs, you will be asked to leave the venue.
30. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
31. There will be a pay on the day if time allows.
32. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
33. Sponsors of this show are: The Kennel Club, Camddwr canine Ltd, Joint Aid, Colimanor, Trophy Pet Foods, SWAG, Kernow Plumb Force, & Doggy Stylin UK.
34. WELFARE OF DOGS. An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any, action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
35. There may be a certified photographer/video cameraman on site taking photo's/videos of competitors.
It is up to the individual competitor to make it known that they do not wish themselves to be photographed or videoed before they run.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

CLASSES WILL BE SPLIT IF ENTRY WARRANTS IT

Clean up after your dogs (Remember your torch for when it is dark). Competitors failing to comply will be asked to leave the Venue **(as per Regulation 29)**.

Trophies: To 1ST Place in all classes, to 2nd if 30 dogs or more and to 3rd if 50 dogs or more
Rosettes will be awarded to approximately 10% of the entry in all classes.
Clear Round Rosettes in ALL Classes

REGULATIONS 2014

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows and the class name in the schedule should replicate exactly the name of the competition as stated in these regulations.

All Kennel Club supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat (except where individual competition rules state differently). Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

The handler that qualifies a dog for the Quarter-Final/Semi-Final/Final will be the handler that competes, Handler substitutions not allowed.

All winners of the Olympia Grand Finals will be invited to compete in the following year's Quarter-Finals /Semi-Finals without qualifying through the usual procedure via heats. For the Novice winner this will be dependant on the dog still being eligible for grades 3 – 5 on the date of entries closing for the Kennel Club International Agility Festival

(These rules would be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club agility regulations during the course of the competition year).
