Dogs can only be entered in <u>three</u> classes (plus Pay On The Day if run), except for dogs entering Any Size classes who may enter a maximum of <u>two</u> classes (plus Pay On The Day if run)

Only dogs competing at the show may enter any Pay On The Day class OR use the Practice Ring

Classes 17 and 17a are one class, please state which part of the class you want to compete in on your entry form

Classes 25 and 25a are one class, please state which part of the class you want to compete in on your entry form

Dogs entered in classes 17, and 25 may not enter any of classes 1-16 or 18-24 inclusive

Please note rubber contacts will be used at the show

AWARDS

Rosettes to 10% of entry in all classes

Trophies to 3rd place if 50 or more dogs in a class,

Trophies to 2nd place if 30 – 49 dogs entered in a class

Trophies to 1st place if less than 30 dogs entered in a class

Clear Round Rosettes in all classes to be collected on the day

Rosette for Best Unplaced Cornwall Agility Club Member in all classes.

Special Any Size Classes(classes 17, 17a, 25 & 25a)) to be placed to 6th or 10% of entry if over 60 dogs entered in this class

IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO COLLECT YOUR ROSETTE OR TROPHY IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO EITHER ARRANGE FOR A FRIEND TO COLLECT ON YOUR BEHALF OR PROVIDE ENVELOPE/PACKAGING AND POSTAGE FOR THEM TO BE DELIVERED TO YOU BY POST.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship agility, Premier agility, Open agility or Limited agility shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events accepted) Only a first place with a clear round within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact obstacles and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs having which have gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for grade 3,4,6,or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for grade 3,4,5,or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Special Any size Jumping and Special Any Size Steeplechase

Open to all sizes of dogs not entered in any other class in this show. There will be no tyre or weaves in these classes. The maximum number of obstacles to be negotiated will be 18.

CHILDREN UNDER 16

The duty of care remains with the parent(s) or other accompanying responsible adult(s) at all times

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, large dogs who have not competed before 1st January 2006 and ALL Small and Medium dogs <u>MUST</u> have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.

Record books may be inspected at the request of the Judge or show management.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
- 2. Entry fees: £3.00 per dog per class. Cornwall Agility Club helping members £2.25 per dog per class. No refunds will be given on incorrect entries. Nor after closing date, unless covered by rule 16.
- 3. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 4. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
- 5. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
- 7. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 8. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie, not attached by a ring.
- 9. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 10. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 11. The Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
- 12. The heights of the jump obstacles will be as per rule H(1)(B)3a, ie 650mm for **large** dogs, 450mm for **medium** dogs, and 350mm for **small** dogs. For Special Classes see under 'Eligibility For Classes'.
- 13. The Height limit for dogs:
- a) Large Dog classes For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
- b) Medium Dog classes For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
- c) Small Dog classes For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
- 14. Judges at an agility show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to be handled by the scheduled judges spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled spouse.
- 15. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:
- a) A bitch which is in season.
- b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
- c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
- d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
- e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 16. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 4 April 2013, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 17. Should circumstances so dictate the Club, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 18. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted by the individual to the Show Secretary within 1 month of the show date together with the competitor's running orders.
- 19. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- 20. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
- 21. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
- 22. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 23. It is the competitors responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 24. Animals in Event
 - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
 - However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 25. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
- 26. Pay on the Day classes may be run if time permits. (Only for competing dogs entered in the show.)
- 27. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
- 28. Welfare of Dogs
 - An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- 29. Competitors' briefing will be held prior to the start of each class, when they will be allowed to walk the course but without the dog accompanying them. No food may be taken into the ring. No pushchairs or prams will be allowed in the rings
- 30. Handlers must display their ring numbers at all times whilst competing.
- 31. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
- 32. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.

- 33. The owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at the Show must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the Licensed Venue including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. When not competing, dogs must be leashed at all times unless in a designated exercise or warm up area.
 - When using the Warming up area please be considerate to other competitors and their dogs.
- 34. All dogs are entered at their owner's risk and, whilst taking every care, the Club cannot be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
- 35. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking and conduct within the show boundaries and any person directing abuse to Stewards or Officials will be asked to leave the venue immediately.
- 36. No cycling, children's scooters or skateboards will be permitted around the area of the rings.
- 37. Any owner, handler or the person in charge of the dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) within the venue. Anyone failing to remove fouling will be asked to leave the venue immediately.
- 38. No smoking will be permitted in or around any of the tented or other enclosed areas on the showground.
- 39. Organisers of Open Agility shows may set a capping level on the entries to be accepted in any standard or special class, and may decline entries received after the capping level has been reached. State if specific classes are to be capped and the capping limit. The capping level must be set at a minimum of 250 entries received. There is no maximum level at which a cap may be set.
