ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact obstacles and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Veterans

The class is open to Large, Medium and Small dogs aged 9 years and over on the date of competition and not entered in any other classes over the weekend (Veteran and Any Size classes excepted). Jump heights for all dogs will be 350mm or 228mm at the handlers discretion. There will be no weaves or tyre. All dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's chosen jump height with one set of awards.

Any Size Jumping & Any Size Agility

Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes over the weekend (Veteran and Any Size classes excepted). Jumps heights for all dogs will be set at 350mm, 228mm or 550mm at the handler's discretion and courses will not contain a tyre or weaves. The course time will be 60 seconds. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's chosen jump height with one set of awards. The course will be very simple and flowing. Any Size Agility will include a low height 'A' frame.

Any Size Jumping Qualifier

Final to be held at the Adams Show at Catton Hall, Walton on Trent on Saturday 18th May 2013. The top 5 dogs will qualify.

Agility for Juniors

- 1. The competition is split into 2 Classes Under and Over 12 years old but under 18.
- 2. The competition is open to all heights of dogs.
- 3. All heights of dog will compete against each other.
- 4. The competition will be judged under current KC rules and regulations. All competitors will be deemed to have accepted these rules



For each dog entered into the class a sum of £1.10 will go into the winner's jackpot. Winner takes all!!

The 4th Height Cup (Special)

There are many dogs, no matter how fit and agile, that struggle to jump the current Large height because they are naturally "smaller". This competition has been put together to give these dogs a chance to jump at a height more comfortable to them. All jumps in this class will be set at 550mm, which represents the 4th Height that so many would like to see brought into standard KC Classes. The introduction of a pole at the height of 550mm brings the percentage difference between the height of the smallest dog in these classes and the height of the jump, into line with existing Medium height and with the dogs at the upper end of the current Large height bracket. Having a more appropriate jump height will allow more dogs and handlers to partake in the activity they enjoy in KC shows, supporting the KCs own stated objective of popularising canine events by focusing on the retention of existing participants and the attracting of new.

Show and Venue for the final – To be confirmed

Rules

- 1. The class is open to all Grade 1-7 dogs
- 2. All jumps will be at 550mm.
- 3. Standard Kennel club marking will apply
- 4. The top three dogs qualify from each heat. In the event of a class being split, the top two places will be taken from each part.
- 5. Dog may only qualify for final once. In the event that a dog in qualifying place has previously qualified for the final, the next placed dog shall qualify. Please advise the ring party if you have already qualified.
- 6. Handlers may qualify more than one dog for the final

Adams Jumping Cup Sponsored by Adams Agility

This is a standard class and will count towards grade progression.

Heats to be held at each of the Adams Agility shows throughout the year with the final being held at the last Adams Show, August 2013. The first four handlers and dogs in each heat to go forward to the Final.

Heats

A heat would need to be split into two parts subject to the number of dogs entered exceeded KC maximums. This would mean a duplicate of prizes with the first two handlers and dogs in each part going forward.

Adams Jumping Cup - Rules & Regulations

Eligibility for the competition under the Kennel Club classification and open to dogs working grades 1-3 and 4-7 (separate qualifiers and final). The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by those Rules and Regulations.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Each heat is open to all competitors eligible for Grades 1-3 and separately Grades 4-7.

Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are eligible. Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Show Secretary on the date of the show of this fact.

The first 4 from each heat going through to the final, 5th and 6th place being reserves for that heat. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, reserves will be taken from the appropriate heat.

Surrogate Handlers will not be allowed.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
- 2. Entry fees are £2.90 per dog per class. Devon Dogs Jumping Sweepstake £4.00 per dog for each dog entered a sum of £1.10 will go into the winners jackpot.
- 3. Entries will only be accepted on the official form or photocopy thereof. Entries may also be made via the internet at www.ishowservices.com.
- 4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 5. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
- 6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
- 10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 1. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 12. Thank you to our sponsors
- 13. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply for all Standard classes.
- 14. The height of hurdles for Veterans 350mm or 228mm (competitor's choice) Any size will be 350mm 228mm and 550mm (competitors choice). Any size agility will have a lower height. A frame only
- The Height limit for dogs:
 - a. Large Dogs For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
 - b. Medium Dogs For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
- 16. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 17. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:
- 18. A bitch, which is in season.
- 19. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
- 20. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
- 21. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
- 22. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 23. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (13/04/2013) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors' responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 24. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 25. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
- 26. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- 27. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
- 28. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
- 29. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show/showground.
- 30. Competition of Dog's Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 31. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 32. Animals in Event No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times
- 33. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 34. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits
- 35. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
- 36. Welfare of Dogs
 - An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
- 37. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the Committee and Organisers will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused to persons, dogs or property at the show.
- 38. Overpaid entries will NOT be refunded.
- 39. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries and any person directing abuse will be removed from the showground.
- 40. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of the committee.
- 41. Training equipment is not allowed.
- 42. DOGS ARE NOT TO BE LEFT LOOSE IN 'GARDEN' AREAS OR TETHERED TO VEHICLES WITHOUT BEING ATTENDED.
- 43. Please pick up after your dog and deposit the waste in the bags provided. If you fail to clean up after your dog, you will be asked to leave the venue.
- 44. No refunds after closing date other than exceptional circumstances.
- 45. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.
- 46. The 4th height cup is open to all KC large dogs (no measuring will be required). The height of the jumps will be set at 550mm and is open to all grades1-7 large dogs.



The Camddwr Cup

Following the feedback from Agility people after the withdrawal of their former sponsor CSJ, Ann and Stuart Harmes have confirmed that the Novice Competition will continue, with the support of RAS Rosettes. It will be known as The Camddwr Cup. All heats will take place at licensed Kennel Club events and will be held under KC rules and regulations. It will be open to eligible dogs from Grades 3 to 5.

The Grand Final

The Final will take place by kind permission of the Dog Vegas team, and will be held in the beautiful setting of Bakewell- This will be at their three day September Show, 2012 from the 28th to the 30th September 2012. The Final will be held on the Saturday early evening.

Rules & Regulations

The Camddwr Cup will consist of eight heats which be held at various Kennel Club Licensed Agility shows around the country. These heats will run throughout the year with the Grand Final being held by kind permission of the Dog Vegas team, at the Bakewell Agility Show in September. The first four handlers and dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

Prizes:

- Rosettes to 20th Place
- Trophies
- 1st to 3rd place in each heat,
- Product and or vouchers may be provided by the sponsors.

Should a heat need to be split, the prize allocation should be discussed with the host club and the organisors, a duplicate set of prizes will be provided should the numbers exceed KC maximum numbers allowed, and the qualifying places will be split between each part.

Eligibility for the competition

Each heat will run under the Kennel Club classification and open to dogs working grades three four and five.

The competition must be held and judged under the appropriate Kennel Club rules and regulations. Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by those Rules and Regulations.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. Each heat is open to all competitors eligible for Grades Three Four and Five.

Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are eligible.

Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Show Secretary on the date of the show. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, reserves will be invited.

Surrogate Handlers will not be allowed.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- ♦ Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog always stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. DIRECTIONS FROM THE EAST OR NORTH

From the M5 Junction 31 follow signs onto the A30 West, clearly signed to Okehampton/Bodmin. Continue along the dual carriageway to the exit sign-posted Okehampton (B3260), then exit the A30. At the end of the slip-road (with the BP garage on your left), turn right and drive down the hill into Okehampton. In the middle of the town you will come to traffic lights opposite the White Hart pub (on the far left). Go straight on at these lights and after one mile, at the top of the hill, turn right (sign-posted Northlew). Continue along this road for half a mile and take the right turn sign-posted Northlew. Continue on this road for 0.3 miles, then go straight on at the Hilltown Cross crossroads. The Grange EC is 1.5 miles further along this road, on the left.

DIRECTIONS FROM THE WEST OR SOUTH

Exit the A30 at Sourton Cross (A386 sign-posted Tavistock/Bideford) following signs to Bideford. Go past the Shell filling station and the Little Chef restaurant on your left, and follow the road for 2.1 miles until you come to a mini-roundabout (Fowley Cross). Turn right, following signs to Bideford. After 0.4 miles turn left at the mini-roundabout (sign-posted to Northlew). After a further 0.2 miles take the second left, sign-posted to Northlew. The Grange EC is 1.5 miles along this road, on the left.

From Tavistock.continue North to the A30 main junction at Sourton Cross. Go past the Shell filling station and the Little Chef restaurant on your left, and follow the road for 2.1 miles until you come to a mini-roundabout (Fowley Cross). Turn right, following signs to Bideford. After 0.4 miles turn left at the mini-roundabout (sign-posted to Northlew). After a further 0.2 miles take the second left, sign-posted to Northlew. The Grange EC is 1.5 miles along this road, on the left.
